This year's eggs are beginning to hatch! They are located at the top of the stairs on the 3rd floor if you'd like to take a peek.

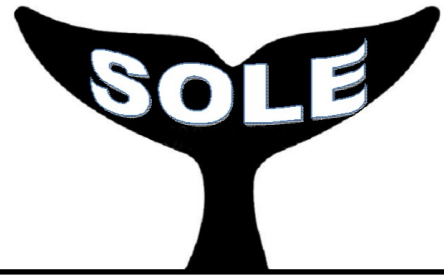


At Chautauqua we focus on Respect for SOLE

Led by Glenda Berliner's multi-age class, the CES Food Drive collected 570 pounds of food last December for the Vashon Food Bank.



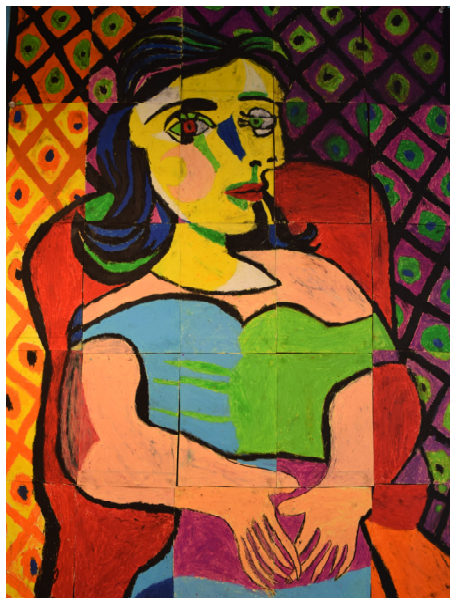
Martin Luther King Jr. Assembly
